



Conditions of Entry

The following policy is in effect before, during and after all West Sydney Wolves Sports Association (WSWSA) and affiliated bodies' programs and events to ensure the safety and comfort of our guests and members. Additional rules and regulations may be posted on WSWSA property or communicated through WSWSA staff.

By entering the venue, all persons agree to be bound by the following terms and conditions.

- All persons must be a member of WSWSA to enter the facility unless approved otherwise by Wolves Management, or hold temporary membership as per WSWSA membership offers
- Management reserves the right to inspect and / or search bags brought into or out of the venue. This may require the persons assistance.
- Management maintains the right to refuse entry, place restrictions, close the venue or evict individuals as they see fit within the confines of the law.
- Persons who use offensive or threatening language, cause a disturbance, or refuse to comply with requests made by WSWSA staff will be evicted and may have their membership cancelled.
- Alcohol cannot be brought into or taken from the WSWSA
- Smoking is not permitted anywhere on the premises including anywhere within the fence line of the facility.
- Mobile phones, cameras or filming devices must not be used in or near toilets or change rooms. The use of such equipment remains at the discretion of management of WSWSA
- Person's consent to the recording of their image or likeness including audio and visual.
- Persons bringing personal items into the WSWSA do so at their own risk and WSWSA will not be held responsible for any damages to, loss or theft of personal property.

For the comfort, safety and enjoyment of all persons, management reserves the right to:

- Refuse entry to any persons within the confines of the law, entry to any unauthorised persons, entry to persons who attempt to bring any restricted or prohibited items into WSWSA venues

Prohibited Items

The following items are not permissible at WSWSA venues unless authorised:

- Glass (including bottles) or cans, metal or hard plastic containers (like eskies), metal water bottles, plastic bottles over 750mL and any other breakable containers.
- Alcoholic beverages and controlled or dangerous illicit drugs
- All animals except guidance or assistance animals



- Pushbikes, Skateboards, roller blades or similar equipment.
- Chairs/ stools
- Firearms and explosives*
- Incendiary devices including flares, fireworks, and smoke bombs
- Chemical, radioactive or biological substances
- Camera tripods and detachable lenses above 300mm
- Professional cameras, audio recording devices or video cameras
- Musical instruments
- Advertising material or flyers
- Large flags and/ or banners exceeding 1.6m
- Commercial, political, or offensive clothing, banners, logos or signage
- Any large item that cannot be placed under a seat
- Any items or goods for public sale.
- Laser lights
- Any other item or device that at the discretion of WSWSA management, has the potential to cause harm or public nuisance.

**Off duty police officers and other law enforcement officers may NOT bring firearms or concealed weapons into the facility.*

Restricted Items

- Closed umbrellas may be taken into WSWSA venues
- Prams and pushers are permitted into the WSWSA venues; however, it must be able to fit safely by or under your seat without impeding access or having the potential to cause harm to others.
- Laptops may not be used in areas except for the café area. In all other areas, laptops must be stored in your bag.

Flags & Banners

Flags and banners exceeding 1.6m in length are considered prohibited items and are not permitted into WSWSA venues.

Such items must either be surrendered and cloaked or taken back to the patron's vehicle. The following items are also prohibited:



- Large flags/ banners taking up more space than the patron's seat
- Flags/ banners that may cause offence
- Flags/ banner that conflict with WSWSA venues or event sponsors

A hirer may also impose further restrictions on the types of permitted flags or banners.

Liquor Licensing

All persons entering The Wolves Sports Centre are advised that:

- They are entering licensed premises
- The Wolves Sports Centre supports the responsible service of alcohol.
- Intoxicated persons will not be permitted to enter or asked to leave the premises
- It is an offence for minors to purchase and consume liquor, or for a person to supply alcohol to a minor
- Liquor may only be consumed in designated areas
- Persons under 25 years of age may need to show valid ID as proof of age for purchase and consumption of liquor.
- Persons supplying liquor to minors will be reported to the Police. Penalties apply under the Liquor Act 2007.

Smoking

Smoking and/ or vaping is not permitted inside WSWSA or within 10m of the external doors. Should you wish to smoke or vape, please do so via the designated areas on the external concourse.

Tickets

- Event tickets, mobile or hard-copy, must be retained at all times.
- Any event tickets that are damaged, defaced or have been purchased from an unauthorised ticketing agent will not permit the holder to be admitted to the Centre.
- Patrons must only occupy the seats specified on their ticket.
- Patrons who have purchased a concessional ticket for an event must be able to provide valid proof of concession (i.e. proof of age identification or concession card) upon entry into the Centre or when requested.



Under CIVIL LIABILITIES ACT 2002; General Admission Crowds may cause Recreational Risks. Patrons must assess their own risk on entry.
